A review of 2021!

Welcome 2022! The City stayed busy in 2021. In February the Board of Aldermen approved an agreement with the Hallsville School District to put a School Resource Officer in place. With the Covid-19 restrictions, the Hallsville Park Board held their annual Easter Egg Hunt using a drive-thru method but were able to hold a movie in the park by June. Public Works began street repairs in Meadows Ledg. Also in 2021 Public Works Assistant Christopher Lowhorn received recognition for 5 years of service with the City of Hallsville, Sergeant Jeffrey Voss with the Hallsville Police Department received a Mayor's Proclamation for going about the call of duty while performing a lifesaving act, and LaDonna McLane received recognition for 15 years of service as a school crossing guard.

<u>Ordinance 385</u> - AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HALLSVILLE, COUNTY OF BOONE, STATE OF MISSOURI - Done yearly to update state statutes

<u>Ordinance 386</u> - AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH NORTHRIDGE MOBILE HOME PARK TO DIRECTLY BILL AND COLLECT FOR WATER, SEWER, & TRASH

<u>Ordinance 388</u> - AN ORDINANCE REPLACING ORDINANCE 336 TO ESTABLISH A PROCEDURE TO DISCLOSE **POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND SUBSTANTIAL INTERESTS FOR CERTAIN OFFICIALS -** Passed every two years

<u>Ordinance 389</u> - AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING SECTIONS 400.020 MEMBERSHIP; COMPENSATION; TERMS; VACANCIES; REMOVAL AND SECTION 400.030 COMMISSION, OFFICERS, RULES, RECORDS, EMPLOYEES, EXPENDITURES-ZONING COMMISSION TO CONSTITUTE PLANNING COMMISSION

<u>Ordinance 390</u> - AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 500. BUILDING REGULATIONS; ARTICLE 1. BUILDING CODE ENFORCEMENT; SECTION 500.025(B) BUILDING CODE ADOPTED WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF HALLSVILLE, MISSOURI

The Park Board also had a busy 2021. Flower boxes were made and donated to the park. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, the 2021 Easter Egg Hunt was a drive-thru event but they were able to have two Movies in the Park once the restrictions were lifted some. With the help from the Public Works Department, they installed a set of bleachers that were donated by the Police Foundation of Hallsville, two new spring riders, and had the merry-goround sand blasted and painted. The Park Board held a 20 year September 11th Walk at the Park. There was a nice turn out. The 6th Annual 'Trick or Treat' in the Park went back to it's old format and was a great success. The Park Board put out a survey in 2021 and used the data to create their 5-year plan for Tribble Park. They have a lot of wonderful plans for the future of Tribble Park. Bulky trash items include furniture, stoves, washing machines, water tanks, and other sizable waste materials that two men can lift. Refrigerators, ice makers, freezers, and window air conditioners need a certificate from a technician certifying removal of Freon from the appliance. NO construction debris will be picked up.
