### with Ward 1 Candidates for the April 6<sup>th</sup> General Municipal Election

*Incumbent: Carli Carmack*



**Tell the voters about yourself and why you decided to run again.**

First, I would like to say thank you to Ward 1 for allowing me to represent you these last two years. I've been in Hallsville since the Summer of 2006 and have been amazed with the amount of growth our city has experienced.

Outside of my duties on Hallsville's

City Council – I am employed at the University of Missouri. I work in the Office of Sponsored Programs Administration. Our office oversees external grants and contracts awarded to the Curators of the University of Missouri. In my free time I like to spend time with my husband, Jordan and four-year-old son, Lincoln. I also like to travel and play softball when time allows.

I decided to run again for Ward 1 because I enjoy helping as many people as I can and feel this is a great way to assist my local community. I also have taken an interest in municipal government and learning the ins and outs of how our city runs. I believe I bring a positive and unique perspective to the Board of Aldermen. I hope to be re-elected so that I can continue being a part of our city's council, keeping our citizen's best interest in mind.

**Please list current and past public service, activism, and volunteerism.**

I have loved volunteering my whole life. Growing up I was involved in just about every school club that was possible for me to be a part of. My favorite projects always involved giving back to my local community – whether it be trash pickups, visiting senior centers, raising money for those less fortunate, or donating blood. Currently I am a part of Beta Sigma Phi – Alpha Eta Iota. This is a local service sorority that organizes fundraisers to help those in need within our local community. In the past few years, we have helped families pay medical bills, utilities, college expenses, and provided assistance during the holidays for those struggling to make ends meet.

Aside from being part of organizations, I am an avid blood donor. I currently am a blood program leader for the American Red Cross – meaning I help organize and promote local blood drives. Also, I have just recently, in November of 2020, worked my first election. I had always wanted to work an election and am so glad I was given the opportunity to be an election judge at Hallsville's community center. Being able to assist in the 2020 Presidential election really opened my eyes to that process and gave me a better appreciation for other poll workers across the nation.

**What do you believe is the single most compelling issue facing the City of Hallsville?** I believe the single most compelling issue facing the City of Hallsville is our outdated wastewater system. Over the years there has been a need to address

parts of our wastewater system, however with limited funds and continued growth, this continues to be an issue. We are currently working with Missouri American Water and Missouri Public Service Commission to complete the sale of our system; however, Boone County Regional Sewer District has filed a motion to intervene.

**If you could make one change/improvement what would that change/improvement be?** One change/improvement that I would like to see made is the addition of new bathrooms at our park. As we work with our Park Board to update and clean up our park – the need for renovated restrooms should be towards the top of our list.

**What is your vision for the future of the City of Hallsville?** My vision for the future of the City of Hallsville includes the addition of more businesses and places to eat for our community. We have grown a lot in the last 5 years and with multiple newly developed subdivisions – I feel the need for businesses will continue to be a need for our city. I would love to see a recreation center in our future as well. This would greatly benefit our citizens in various ways across all age groups.

**Tell the voters about yourself and why you decided to run again.** I graduated from Hallsville high school after attending since kindergarten. I have lived in Ward 1 continuously since I was in fourth-grade. In 2018, I became a substitute teacher. And since 2019, I've worked at Hallsville Intermediate as an instructional aide.

**Please list current and past public service, activism, and volunteerism.** Hallsville Alumni Association Board member, since 2015; Boone County election judge, since 2018; Mid-Missouri Solid Waste Management District city representative, since 2018; Hallsville Board of Aldermen member, 2018 to 2020; Hallsville Park Board member, since 2020; Planning & Zoning Board of Adjustments alternate member, since 2020.

**What do you believe is the single most compelling issue facing the City of Hallsville?** The sewer system is the single most compelling issue facing the city. Currently, the Boone County Regional Sewer District (BCRSD) is fighting the sale of the sewer system. If the system is sold the burden of operating it is removed from the city. This limbo the BCRSD has created makes it harder to plan the annual budget.

**If you could make one change/improvement what would that change/improvement be?** I would bring more business and industry to the city. This would increase revenue for the city and school district. The increased revenue would allow the city to complete public work priorities, offer competitive salaries, and provide quality services and options to residents. This one change would have a wonderful effect on the community.

**What is your vision for the future of the City of Hallsville?** My vision for the future of Hallsville is to keep the momentum of growth. I would love to see the city limits expand, a population of 3,000, diverse eateries, more community organizations, and state roads promptly tended to.

## Water/Sewer Disconnections in the City of Hallsville

Water bills are due by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month. A 5% late fee is assessed on the 11<sup>th</sup>. If your account is not paid by the 20<sup>th</sup> there will be a \$35.00 nonpayment fee assessed and service will be subject to disconnection. A charge of \$25.00 is added to turn your water back on.

The first time you fail to pay you will receive a letter from City Hall advising of the charges and disconnection ordinance.

## Trash



- Trash pick-up is Wednesday and should be put out **at the curbside the night before.**
- No yard waste or brush is allowed in your trash collection.
- Bulky trash day is the third Wednesday of every month.

## RECYCLING BIN INFORMATION



You do not need to use any bags when using the recycling bin at the Community Center.

They expect all material in the dumpster to be recyclable. Please keep in mind that plastic bags are not recyclable, so they encourage using a cardboard box or reusable plastic tub to help transport your material to the bin location. If you decide that plastic bags are more convenient, at this time you can still throw the bag of recycled material in the bin.

Littering citations are still being issued for leaving recyclable items and/or trash on the ground around the bin. If the bin is full, please do not leave your recycling outside of the recycling bin.



### When do I need a building permit?

A permit is required for any construction that physically changes or adds structures to your property or for work regulated by codes or resolutions, such as:

#### **New Building**

Examples include but are not limited to: dwellings, garages, car ports, detached storage sheds, pole barns, or commercial buildings.

#### **Additions**

Examples include but are not limited to: buildings, porches, and decks.

#### **Alterations/Remodeling**

Any construction involving structure, electrical, plumbing, insulation, roofing, gas line installation or upgrade.

#### **Demolition**

The County does not require a demolition permit, however the City does.
