Public Works Spotlight

The Hallsville Public Works is currently staffed with three full-time employees and during the summer hires an additional two seasonal employees.



Tyler Spears is the newest full-time Public Works Assistant. Tyler started with the City in December of 2018. Since joining the Public Works Department, Tyler has earned his Drinking Water Distribution Class II operators certificate. What Tyler likes most about his job is that there is always something new to

learn and you never know from day to day what knowledge will come in handy. Since Tyler started with the City, Public Works has started repairing and maintaining their own machines and vehicles in an effort to save money. He has been a mechanic in the past and wanted something that he could apply that knowledge to while learning something new.

Hallsville Police Department Spotlight

The Hallsville Police Department is currently staffed with three full-time officers, two part-time officers, and five reserve officers.



Jeff Voss joined the Hallsville Police Department in March of 2019 as a part-time officer. In June he became a full-time officer and in July was promoted to Sergeant. Prior to

Hallsville, Sergeant Voss spent four years in the United States Army and has worked in law enforcement since 2006.

Voss is most proud of being able to help the community he serves in more ways than one. When asked what was something that the public may not know about being in law enforcement, Voss stated that what most people know about cops is from watching TV or reading someone's firsthand experience from Facebook. This is why people believe that every arrest must be immediately followed by a Miranda warning, that there is a team of FBI agents who fly to crime scenes in an executive jet and solve the case within days, that detectives in one major PD can move to another, and that cops who are involved in shootings are back to work the next day. Voss advised that he was born in Hallsville in the mid 80's and has always considered it his home.
